
Funding Requirements

LOC Requirements

- Environmental
 - Floodplain (above 500-year flood)
- Easements / Rights-of-Way (ROWs)
- Interim Financing
- Permits

USDA-RD Phase 1 Loan Fixed

Loan fixed at \$12 million for Residents and Business



Addressing Miami 80%/20% Grant Rumor

Rumor Says Going to Miami will Allow for 80% Grant

- Miami did receive and 80%/20% Grant/Loan offer was a fortunate package received
- No longer possible
- New process the issuance of funding from Washington DC
- USDA-RD requested TRSD obtain addition grant funding from other sources to help cover increased costs
- TRSD has been active and successful in pursuing additional grant funds

Impact With Not Building TRSD WRF

If TRSD chooses not to build new WRF for another option (i.e. Miami)

- Loss of current funding of \$28M (\$16M Grant)
- Loss of 2 to 3 years or more in time
 - New Preliminary Engineering Report (PER)
 - New Environmental Assessment (EA)
 - New funding offer
- What the New Funding would most likely look like
 - Increase in Loan amount

DISINGENUOUS



"We understand the need for a wastewater system for those individuals who need it. We also understand the health concerns and environmental issues that can come from cesspools and substandard septic tanks. But we would like this done in the most cost effective and transparent way possible since the financial burden will fall on the property owners."

- Those individuals 1,750 residences and businesses on banned cesspools and substandard septic tanks out of 1,900 units)
- Cost effective from its inception, the Project has been scrutinized for its cost effectiveness by the USDA Rural Development (state and national offices), Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) and multiple federal agencies from which the District is seeking grant funding
- Transparent to be discussed on the following slide
- Financial burden will fall on the property owners The District understands that financial hardship exists and will engage with property owners to address assessment and O/M cost needs

TRANSPARENT

HOW THE DISTRICT ACHIEVES TRANSPARENCY

- Conducts board meetings according to Arizona's
 Open-Meeting Law
- Publishes board meeting agendas and minutes on its web site
- · Answers questions from the public on its website
- Conducts public project workshops
- Maintains both a TRSD website and Facebook site and YouTube

TRANSPARENT

HOW THE DISTRICT ACHIEVES TRANSPARENCY

- Addresses local service organizations as requested
- Submits annual budgets as required by State
 Statutes
- Maintains an up-to-date roster of board members on its website
- Retains a recognized, outside agency to audit financial statements
- Provides information to the public through the Freedom of Information Act

NONTRANSPARENT

- The Group that is intent on connecting the District to the Town of Miami (TOM) has stated that the TOM has the capacity to treat the District's wastewater. That Group is being nontransparent or has no information on the following critical issues.
 - Where is the Cost Information
 - Who Will Provide What Service
 - Where is the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA)
 - What May be the Results of This Action
