- Item # 7 Update on the submittal of two applications for Two Clean Water State Revolving Fund loans from the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) for the Engineering/Design and, as appropriate, follow-on elements for Phases II/III of the TRSD project. L. Valdez reported on progress, paperwork is being assembled. The WIFA Board will meet on February 18, 2023. If approved, may close but could not fund until the District receives the Letter of Conditions from USDA-RD. USDA will complete the underwriting package and will submit it to the national office by end of January, 2023. Funding is then expected, hopefully, by the end of first quarter 2023.
